The Humboldt Arts Council is pleased to present *Stories*, a photographic exhibition by Chicago native Nate Larson. Larson's photographic work explores the way that we construct meaning in contemporary culture through the lenses of both religious and secular cultures. His work investigates the line between belief and skepticism, while examining the idea of personal truth as well as the common misperception of the objectivity of the photographic document. The exhibition features Larson's recent works, a series of photographic documentations of what he terms the "supernormal." Clad in a white shirt and tie, Larson poses in the photographs as an ordinary character that experiences depicted events, such as miracles. His work focuses on exposing the tension between photographs serving as visual "proof" of an occurrence and the process of constructing ones system of belief.

The Morris Graves Museum of Art, located at 636 F Street, Eureka is open to the public noon-5p.m., Wednesday through Sunday. Museum admission is by donation: \$4 for adults, \$1 for seniors age 55 and older; HAC Members and children age 12 and under are admitted free. Admission is always free for everyone during each First Saturday Arts Alive!, 6-9 p.m.
