Rhumboogie is a saxophone quartet with Dianne Zuleger playing alto saxophone, Julie Froblum playing baritone saxophone, Susie Laraine playing soprano and tenor saxophones and Randy Carrico playing alto sax, tenor sax and clarinet. They will be performing original compositions and arranged jazz standards.

About the Musicians...

Dianne Zuleger has played sax in various incarnations of the CR Jazz band over the past 25-30 years, as well as playing in For Dancers Only dance orchestra, Big Band Swing and in the pit band for numerous musicals. Dianne also whiles away her time directing and acting with Humboldt's fine live theater ensembles, North Coast Repertory Theater, Redwood Curtain Theater, and past shows at Ferndale Repertory Theater, Pacific Art Center, HSU and CR.

A versatile performer, Julie Froblum has performed and recorded extensively in Northern California. Her background includes playing in classical, swing band and jazz ensembles as well as bands like the hoppin' R & B group "Dr. Ross and the Hellhounds," "Barking Dogma," and blues band "Shakin' Snakes," to name a few.

Susie Laraine performed in sax quartets, jazz combos, big bands and other groups in the SF Bay area before moving to Eureka in 2001. Here she plays with several groups, and gives lessons on saxophone, flute and beginning piano. She is also a ceramic artist and brought a few of her pieces of jazz musicians.

A Humboldt County native, Randy Carrico Randy plays many instruments besides saxophones, both common and unusual; among them are guitar, bass, prim, tambura, cumbus, and trumpet. He is also versatile in many styles and performs with Chubritza, Musaic, Hall Street Honkers, and Big Band Swing.
