This Sunday's Jazz Jam will feature Darius Brotman (piano), Geoff Daugherty (bass), and Ed Campbell (drums)

Darius Brotman hails from Berkeley. He has a degree in music, but only started playing jazz at the age of 32. He's been playing on the local club scene for 20 years in various combinations with the handful of other jazz musicians. In 1999 he received a grant to write an extended jazz suite, *The Rambler*, which was performed at HSU in the fall. He published a technical newsletter on jazz piano (see humboldt1.com/~jazz), and also gives lessons. He hosts "Gone Sides", a jazz show on KHSU (Tuesday evenings at 8:30). He lives in an old farmhouse in the Arcata Bottom with wife Diane (two kids flown), and cooks, builds, does stained glass and wood carving, studies Greek and 18th century letters and repairs his three Volvos
