The Humboldt Arts Council in the Morris Graves Museum of Art is pleased to present a textile exhibition *Linear Expression* in the Knight Gallery by Bay Area artist Deborah Corsini. Deborah Corsini has been weaving for over 30 years and is currently a studio artist exhibiting her work nationally. She holds a Masters in Textiles from San Francisco State University. This exhibition highlights her bold, graphic line, zigzag stripes and scalloped selvages which are striking characteristics of the wedge weave. Instead of weaving perpendicular to the warp, as is usual for tapestry, wedge weave is an eccentric weaving technique where the wefts are woven at an angle. A comprehensive Gallery Activity Pack is available at the Docent Desk to visitors to explore at depth Corsini's technique and work.

The Morris Graves Museum of Art, located at 636 F Street, Eureka is open to the public noon-5p.m., Wednesday through Sunday. Museum admission is by donation: \$4 for adults, \$1 for seniors age 55 and older; HAC Members and children age 12 and under are admitted free. Admission is always free for everyone during each First Saturday Arts Alive!, 6-9 p.m.
