The goal of the KidCo program is to provide quality education in the skills of musical theatre. Singing, dancing, and acting are taught in combination with theatre games and stage etiquette. At the end of each session we give a workshop performance showcasing skills the kids are learning. In the Winter of 1999, Humboldt Light Opera Company (HLO) voted to pursue the development of a year-round, education-based performing arts program for Humboldt county youth, ages 5 to 18, entitled HLO KidCo. This worthwhile venture has already achieved exciting results! To date, over 400 youth, from Bridgeville to Trinidad, have experienced the many positive benefits of the performing arts. ***Ocean Mobiles in the style of Alexander Calder***

**American sculptor Alexander Calder (1898-1976)**, with a career spanning much of the 20th century, is the one of the most acclaimed and influential sculptor of our time. Born in a family of trained artists he began by developing a new method of sculpting: by bending and twisting wire, he essentially "drew" three-dimensional figures in space. He is renowned for the invention of the mobile. Calder also devoted himself to making outdoor sculpture on a grand scale from bolted sheet steel. Today, these sculptures can be found in public plazas in cities throughout the world.
